Advising Notes

Transfers from Michigan Community Colleges

Grand Valley State University is a member of the Michigan Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (MACRAO), which has formulated an agreement between two- and four-year institutions. Students who transfer to Grand Valley and have fulfilled the MACRAO transfer agreement or the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) through a Michigan public community college have satisfied the Foundations categories of the General Education Program and one Supplemental Writing Skills (SWS) course. However, transfer students with a MACRAO or MTA will still need to complete the following requirements: one SWS course in their major or division, the General Education Program two-course Cultures requirement, and the two-course Issues requirement. Bachelor's Degree Requirements at GVSU

The following requirements apply to all undergraduate degree-seeking students:

- 1. A minimum of 120 semester hours
- 2. A cumulative GPA of at least 2.00 GPA.
- 3. Graduation major GPA of at least 2.00.
- 4. General education requirements
- 5. Capstone course is EXS 495
- 6. The last 30 semester hours toward a baccalaureate degree must be earned in Grand Valley courses
- 7. A minimum of 58 semester hours must be earned at a senior (4 yr) institution
- 8. A minimum of 12 Grand Valley earned semester hours must be included in the major (six for a minor)

Advising Notes:

- EN 102 English Composition II must be graded at a "C" or above to receive specific WRT 150 credit in transfer
- Students are advised to complete MOV 304 at GVSU concurrently with the final semester of courses at GRCC prior to transferring. This course is prerequisite to many of the remaining courses in the Exercise Science major.
- All Issues courses must be taken at GVSU
- Students must choose one emphasis to pursue the Exercise Science major. Emphasis areas should be
 chosen based on career and/or post-baccalaureate interests. To see more information on career and

- Students who plan to pursue an advanced degree in Physical Therapy or Athletic Training should work closely with faculty or professional advisors at GVSU to include the appropriate prerequisite courses as part of their undergraduate preparation.
- It is the responsibility of the students to confirm transferability of courses with the receiving institution.

Career or Graduate School Options Based on Emphasis:

Exercise Physiology and Sports Performance:

This emphasis deepens and expands content in human athletic performance and the physiology of training, thus preparing students for careers in strength and conditioning, sports science, biomechanics, and graduate school/academia. There is a proliferation of strength and conditioning related careers at the collegiate and elite (Olympic and professional) levels, in the US and globally.

Physical Activity and Health:

This emphasis deepens content knowledge in health, wellness, and public health, thus preparing students for careers in community wellness, corporate/employee wellness, cardiac rehabilitation, personal training, and graduate school/academia. Provided the noted declines in health and physical activity at a national and global level, there is increasing momentum in health-related careers to enhance the education and delivery of physical activity and exercise-related material.

Exercise Science in Health Care:

This emphasis provides a logical gateway for health professions students (athletic training, physical therapy, occupational therapy, and physician assistant) by broadening their basic biological and physical science background.

Program Agreement

This agreement shall commence as of August 1, 2024. This Program Agreement shall abide by all language of the Institutional Agreement between Grand Rapids Community College and Grand Valley State University.
