

PN 118 Health Illness Concepts for the Practical Nurse

Course Description:		
<p>This course introduces health care recipient, health and illness, and professional nursing and health care concepts. Health care recipient concepts include functional ability and culture. Health and illness concepts include hormonal regulation, nutrition, fluid and electrolytes, elimination, perfusion, gas exchange, immunity, inflammation, infection, pain, stress and coping, and interpersonal violence. Professional nursing and health care concepts include professional identity, clinical judgment, health promotion, communication, collaboration, safety and health care policy. Upon completion, students should be able to provide safe nursing care incorporating the concepts identified in this course.</p>

6. Pharmacological and Parenteral Therapies: The practical nursing student provides care related to the administration of medications and monitors clients who are receiving pa		
7. Reduction of Risk Potential: The practical nursing student identifies the potential for clients to develop complications or health problems related to treatments, procedures or		
8. Physiological Adaptation: The practical nursing student participates in providing care for clients with acute, chronic or life-threatening physical health conditions. (4.D)
