



Sign Language Interpreter Program Transfer Guide

Grand Rapids Community College and Lansing Community College for Sign Language Interpreter C.A. and Sign Language Interpreter A.A.A.

Description

The Sign Language Interpreter is a person specially trained to facilitate communication between the Deaf, Deaf/Blind, Hard of Hearing, and hearing communities. Employment opportunities may be in educational settings, freelance, or contracted with agencies to provide interpreter services for deaf persons. State of Michigan PA 204 of 2007 states that interpreters must possess certification in order to be employed. State credentials Board for Evaluation of Interpreters (BEI), are available through the Bureau of Community and Health Systems (BCHS) in Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) for the State of Michigan. To apply for BEI certification in Michigan, you must have at least an associate degree from an accredited institution. In addition to the State of MI credentials, graduates may also consider taking the Education Interpreters Performance Assessment (EIPA) or National Interpreter Certification (NIC). The NIC requires students to have a bachelor's degree in any field.

Additional Information

Students interested in seeking a degree will complete their general education courses and beginning American Sign Language courses at GRCC before transferring to LCC to complete their degree. After completing their courses at GRCC, students will transfer to LCC during the summer semester to take additional courses that will give them the skills they need to screen into the Sign Language Interpreter Program. Students who wish to transfer to another institution upon completing their degree from LCC should select coursework indicated for that institution and/or check with an advisor from their desired institution. Not all courses in this pathway transfer to all colleges.

Students who already have a bachelor's degree and are interested in gaining the knowledge and skills necessary to undergo interpreter certification testing through a certificate program will complete their beginning sign language courses at GRCC, and then transfer to LCC during the summer semester to take additional courses that will give them the skills they need to screen into the Sign Language Interpreter Program.
